The Sexual & Reproductive Health Clinical Attachment Module provides registered nurses with specialist skills to practice in the areas of sexual and reproductive health. The module consists of a minimum of 50 hours of clinical practice is designed to assist the participant to translate theoretical knowledge in sexual and reproductive health, into competent clinical practice.

Eligibility & Pre-requisites

- Registered nurses
- Current registration with the Queensland Nursing Council or eligible for registration in Queensland
- Minimum 2 years recent post-registration nursing experience
- Successful completion of FPQ courses (or equivalent qualification from another recognised educational facility):
 - Introduction to Sexual & Reproductive Health Theory
 - Pap Smear Provider Module
 - Clinical Aspects in Sexual & Reproductive Health Course

Preference for positions will be given to those nurses currently working, or about to commence work within, the area of sexual and reproductive health.

Note: Registered nurses with significant relevant work experience and/or who have completed theoretical programs in sexual & reproductive health (eg. Theory component from other state family planning organisations) may be able to negotiate alternative placements with the Clinical Nurse Manager at the rate of \$120 per day.

Course Outcomes

On completion of the Clinical Attachment Module, the participant will be able to:

- demonstrate competency in sexual and reproductive health nursing as described in the Queensland Competency Standards to meet the standards for the Advanced Sexual & Reproductive Health Nursing Officer
- maintain professional skills within legislative guidelines

Course Content

To successfully complete the Clinical Attachment Module, participants must complete each of the following components:

1. Clinical attachment component
2. Written assessment requirements
