The Sexual and reproductive health clinical attachment module provides registered nurses with specialist skills to practice in the areas of sexual and reproductive health. The module consists of a minimum of 50 hours of clinical practice and is designed to assist the participant to translate theoretical knowledge in sexual and reproductive health into competent clinical practice.

Eligibility and pre-requisites

- This course is open to registered nurses
- Current registration with AHPRA
- Minimum 2 years recent post-registration nursing experience
- Successful completion of FPQ's (or equivalent qualification from another recognised educational facility):
 - *Introduction to sexual and reproductive health theory*
 - *Pap smear provider module*
 - *Clinical aspects of sexual and reproductive health*

Course outcomes

On completion of the clinical attachment module, the participant will be able to:

- Demonstrate competency in sexual and reproductive health nursing
- Maintain professional skills within legislative guidelines

Course content

To successfully complete the *Sexual and reproductive health clinical attachment module*, participants must complete each of the following:

- Clinical attachment component
- Written assessment requirements
